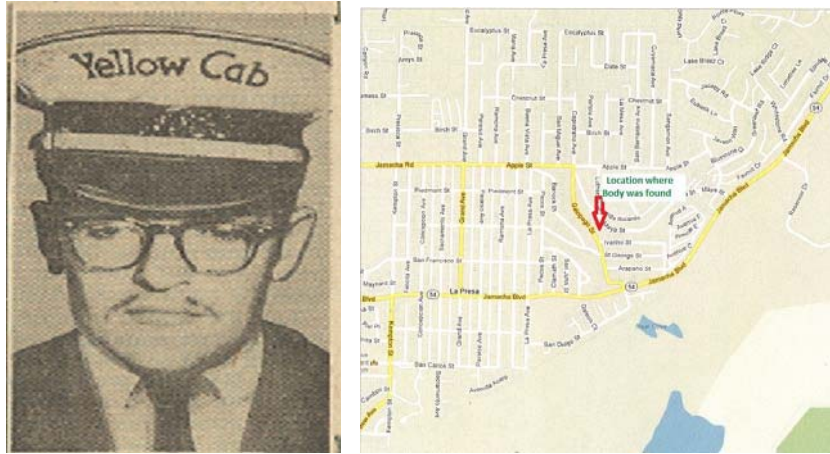


\$1,000 Reward

Who Murdered Larry Hargis?



San Diego County Crime Stoppers and the San Diego County Sheriff's Department's Homicide Detail are asking for the public's help to find the person(s) responsible for the 1970 murder of Yellow Cab Company driver Larry Hargis.

During the pre-dawn hours of June 25, 1970, 27-year-old Larry Hargis radioed the Yellow Cab Company dispatcher saying a fare had asked him to drive from 11th and C Streets in downtown San Diego to the Spring Valley area. That was the last statement the dispatcher heard from Larry Hargis. Later that day, Larry Hargis was found shot to death in a field in the 800 block of Galopago Street in Spring Valley. The victim's wallet and cab were missing. The cab was found abandoned that afternoon in the 1200 block of 16th Street in downtown San Diego.

At the time of the murder, Sheriff's homicide detectives determined robbery was a possible motive but no viable suspects were identified during the original investigation. Cold Case detectives continue to investigate the circumstances surrounding the murder of Larry Hargis.
